- Race to the bottom. Brexit politicians like Boris Johnson want to cut workers' wages and rights. They plan to make workers pay so big corporations can make more profits, and the super-rich can use Britain as a tax haven.
- Wrecking the NHS. People come from all over Europe and the world to keep the NHS running. When politicians promise to cut immigration, they end up sending away nurses and doctors ▶

Politicians are using Brexit as a way to divide us against each other based on where we come from, stoking up hate and racism. We want to keep our communities united and welcoming for all.

But we already had the referendum about Europe? Democracy means we're allowed to change our mind when the facts change. It's now clear that the Tory government has made a dog's dinner of the Brexit deal.

We are heading for a muddle, half-in, half-out of the EU. We'd still have to follow Europe's rules, but won't have a say on them.

We think the most democratic option is for the whole country to get a vote on the final Brexit deal. It's only fair.

TAKING BACK CONTROL

The Brexit politicians said that voting to leave Europe would let us 'take back control'.

But it's not Europe that cut our wages. It's not Europe that closed our factories. It's not Europe that is squeezing our schools and hospitals.

Ten years ago, the political establishment spent billions of pounds on bailing out the banks. We are still paying those debts. They blamed the crisis on too much spending, and let the bankers off the hook.

The government calls this 'austerity'. It means making us all pay the price for a crisis we did not cause.

So to really take back control, we need to tackle the real culprits: big business, the superrich, the bankers and politicians.

There is enough money for everyone to live a decent life, if the richest pay their fair share.

- Higher wages increase the minimum wage and bring in guaranteed hours
- Investment in our communities and services, not cuts
- Build unions, not borders don't end free movement, fight for better pay for all

Millions of people in Britain can't afford a decent place to live. This is because governments stopped building council houses. They've sold off the houses we need and let landlords cash in.

Now we're stuck paying rip-off rents for ever-smaller homes.

The Brexit campaign pinned the blame on immigrants for the housing crisis. But the truth is that this is a crisis made in Westminster.
